#### Principal's note:

Welcome to Term 2. I trust that you had a fabulous 2 weeks with your children at home. It is wonderful to be back at school.

As part of our health and relationships learning this term we are looking at moving our bodies and nutrition. This incorporates cross country and road safety week coming up in week 4. We will be implementing a road safety programme that involves practical cycling activities. We will be teaching:

- · selecting and fitting a cycle helmet
- · checking a bike to see that it meets legal requirements
- · cycle skills exercises to promote confidence and safe bike handling.

These skills meet the requirements of Grade 1 of the *Cyclist Skills Training Guidelines* published by the NZ Transport Agency.

All students will need a bike in good working order. It would be helpful to do a simple bike check of things like brakes, tyre pressure, wheels spinning freely and light oil on the chain before sending to school please. The bikes can be dropped off at school on the 13th of May please and can be collected after Cross Country. If your student does not have a bike please let me know and we will source one for them. Students are also welcome to bring skates, scooters etc as well as a bike.

We have very exciting news! We are so thankful to the Waikoikoi Domain Board. They have granted us permission to use the Waikoikoi Community tennis court to house our hens! What an incredible community Waikoikoi is! This means we have to get our court up to standard for tennis. We will be having a working bee to paint the lines on the court. Please keep an eye out for the date.


